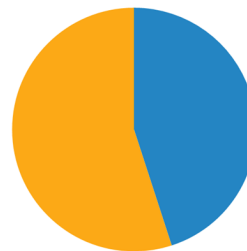
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Tips: Post-Policy Resident Surveys

Now that the smoke-free rule has been in effect for more than a year, many public housing agencies are asking residents how it's going. Check out these findings from Milwaukee, WI and South St. Paul, MN.



At the Housing Authority of the City of Milwaukee, a survey found more than **1 in 5 residents still report smoke** in housing buildings.



A survey in South St. Paul, Minnesota found that **45%** of respondents either **quit or cut back on smoking** since the policy took effect.

Here are some tips for conducting a smoke-free survey of public housing residents:

- Find a community partner to help draft and administer the survey
- Offer an incentive like a gift card raffle
- Translate the survey if necessary
