New Resources: Helping Smokers Quit

The [American Cancer Society](#), [Smoking Cessation Leadership Center](#), and [North American Quitline Consortium](#) created **Tobacco Cessation Resource Directories** for states that participated in a two year project called Smoke-Free Public Housing: Helping Smokers Quit.

The directories can support quitlines, PHAs, Community Health Centers (CHCs), health care providers and others in connecting tobacco users who are interested in quitting with cessation services that best meet their needs. Each directory includes a broad list of national tobacco cessation resources available to and that can be accessed by tobacco users, regardless of state, that complies with the Clinical Practice Guideline Treating Tobacco Use and Dependence 2008 Update. The directories feature the quitline along with face-to-face and online cessation resources.
